Sir,

In terms of this Department's Order no. 1313-J/JD/L/2S-23/04(Pt.-I) dated 17.03.2006 in the matter of "Admissibility of medical facilities to the serving and retired Judicial Officers of the West Bengal Judicial Service", request was made by the Registrar General, Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta vide his letter being Memo no. 910-RG dated 14.02.2019, to move the Government to provide necessary instruction/clarification whether claim for reimbursement for Nurse and Medical Attendant at the residence of a Judicial officers(Serving/Retired) on monthly basis, on the strength of Medical Certificate of the physician and money receipts of the nurse can be reimbursed by the office.

The matter was referred to the Finance Department, Government of West Bengal and the following observations were made vide U.O. NO: Group P1/2020-2021/0286 UO Date 23.12.2020:

"In terms of para II of order No. 1313-J dt 17.03.2006, the serving and retired Judicial officers and Members of their family are entitled to medical benefits as are provided to the MLAs.

In terms of sub-rule 1(b)(vi) of Rule 11 of the West Bengal Legislative Assembly (Medical Facilities to Members) Rules, MLAs are entitled to reimbursement of the cost of Special Nurse, if any.

In view of the position, the serving and retired Judicial officers and members of their family are entitled to re-imbursement of the cost of Special Nurse but not Special Attendant or Aya provided that engagement of such Special Nurse should be made as per recommendation of attending physician."

You are requested to circulate the clarification among all the Judicial officers.
